### **Rules for Lawn Tennis Championship, Aavhan 2018**

The Lawn Tennis Championship of Aavhan 2018 will be conducted on 31<sup>st</sup> March and 1<sup>st</sup> April. This rulebook is binding and will be strictly followed throughout the tournament.

#### **PRIZE MONEY**

##### **Men's Singles**

Reg fees: ₹ 1,000

- Winner: ₹ 8,000
- Runner Up: ₹ 4,000

##### **Men's Doubles**

Reg fees: ₹ 1,600

- Winner: ₹ 10,000
- Runners Up: ₹ 5,000

##### **Women's Singles**

Reg fees: ₹ 500

- Winner: ₹ 5,000
- Runner Up: ₹ 2,500

#### **RULES OF PLAY:**

1. The tournament will be based on the 64-draw knockout format in singles(men), 16-draw knockout format(women) and a 32-draw knockout format in doubles.
2. Each match until the quarterfinals (including the quarterfinals) will consist of a single standard set:
  - a. 6 games to win
  - b. If the score is 5-5, the score must be 7-5 to win
  - c. If the score is 6-6, a 7-point tie breaker will be played with standard tie breaker rules
  - d. In case of a deuce, the player who wins the next point wins the game (ad all)
3. In the semi-finals and final each match in a tie will be best of three sets. The first two sets would be played under standard single set rules (mentioned in pt 2). If the set score ties at 1-1, a decider **third set tiebreak** of 10 points (super tiebreak) will be played
4. Each player must ensure that they are on time for the match. If a player is late by over 20 mins for his match, only then will a walkover be given to the opponent player.
5. In case of any discrepancies during the match, the referee's/organiser's decision will be final. No requests will be entertained.
